## 3 - Input devices

(Unit 5, task 2)

## 1 – The keyboard

This device is <u>used to</u> enter information into the computer. As well as having normal typewriter keys for characters and a numeric keypad, it may also <u>have</u> function keys and editing keys <u>for</u> special purposes.

## 2 – The mouse

This is a device <u>for controlling</u> the cursor and selecting items on the screen. The ball underneath is rolled in any direction across the surface of a desk to move the cursor on the screen. It may have an optical sensor instead of a ball. It usually <u>features</u> two buttons and a wheel. By clicking a button, the user can activate icons or select items and text. A wireless version works withou cables.

## 3 – Light pen

In shape, this input device is similar to an ordinary pen. It <u>works by</u> detecting light from the computer screen and is used by pointing it directly at the screen display. It <u>allows</u> the user <u>to answer</u> multiple-choice questions and to draw diagrams or graphics.
